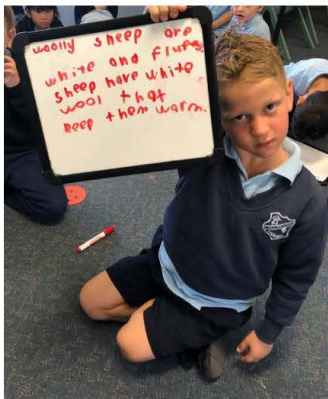
## Academic Corner KB!

What a fantastic start to school life KB have had so far. This year has been one incredibly busy year and we have enjoyed every second of it!



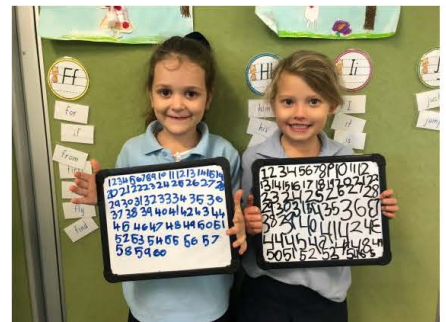

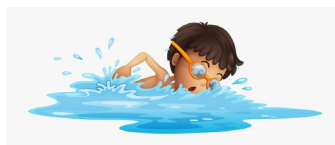

A safety camera situated on the top of the plane, gave students a birds eye view of take-off. One passenger said take-off was rather noisy.

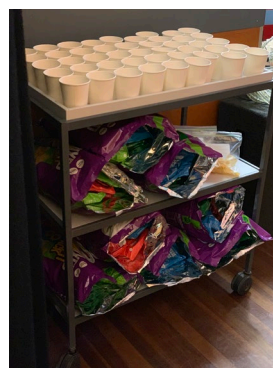
Once in the air, passengers were treated to onboard meals and entertainment.
